March 2nd

Announcement of Diabetes Tech Can't Wait campaign.

March 17th

Parliamentary Motion signed by 3 party leaders, 4 health spokespersons and 28% of all MSPs.

March 20th

We posted the first story shared by our campaigner Shelley Murray.

March 23rd

Launch of our 'postcode look up' tool on our website that shows tech usage per health board.











March 29th

Foysol Choudhury MSP highlights the campaign at the Scottish Government questions.

April 27th

Over 400 people join the campaign.


May 4th

7/14 Health Boards respond to MSP ask of plans for rollout of diabetes tech.

October 25th

Three days of meetings with all political parties and the Minister for Public Health and Women's Health Jenni Minto MSP.













Nov 8th

Speaking with First Minister Humza Yousaf about our campaign.

Nov 14th

The Diabetes Tech Can't Wait campaign is launched at the World Diabetes Day event in Scottish Parliament.

Nov 14th

Three Scottish opposition parties write joint letter to the Minister for Public Health Jenni Minto MSP expressing support for the report recommendations.

Dec 19th


The National Institute of Health Care and Excellence outlines details of who will be offered hybrid closedloop technology in England and Wales.

Feb 7th

Co-ordinated social media to the First Minister: NHS England has a 5-year plan to fund the roll out hybrid closed loop technology. Don't leave Scotland out of the Loop.




WHAT IS DIABETES TECH?



For many people with diabetes, technology can be a very important part of how they manage their diabetes.

There are lots of different types of diabetes tech, like insulin pumps and continuous glucose monitors (CGM for short).




INSULIN PUMPS

- Tethered insulin pumps + patch pumps available.
- Removes need to inject (as often).
- Blood sugar levels more often in your target range.
- Tailor your insulin more easily before, during and after exercise.
- More flexibility in what, when and how much you eat.





CONTINUOUS GLUCOSE MONITORS (CGM)



- Removes need to finger prick (as often).
- You can share your data online with your healthcare team.
- Helps understand how food, activity, and other things affect your sugar levels.
- You can set an alarm to sound if your sugar levels go too low or too high.



HYBRID CLOSED LOOP

- Insulin pump + CGM + algorithm
- The technology 'talks to each other'
- Also called an "artificial pancreas"
- Different insulin pumps and CGMs work together depending on what companies in the industry have teamed up.
- The diabetes community have created a "DIY loop"
